In addition to the business of repair and construction there are several residences being built. Recently Hillsboro township vote \$100,000 in honds for the erection of a modern fire proof school building. The architects plans have been completed and work will begin at an early date. When completed Hillsboro will have one of the best and most modern school buildings in the state.
