Dr. Robert Murphy, financial commissioner, said he felt the commission should be consulted on budgets and the planned expenditure.

## Fire Department Schedules Dedication Ceremony July 25

The truck has arrived and is on display and a gala celebration and picnic is planned July 25 when the Orange Rural Fire Department begins business officially.

A dinner, by ticket, is scheduled for 7 p.m. at the Exchange Club Park with the dedication to follow at 8 p.m. More than 350 persons are expected for the picnic dinner. Marshall Cates of the sponsoring Exchange Club says that 175 tickets are available to the general public for the dinner and are on sale at Hillsborough

Savings and Loan, at Cates Oil or from any Exchange Club member.

Guest speaker for the occasion will be Cosmo Cox, chief of the Durham Fire Department.

In the event of inclement weather, the events will be moved to Cameron Park School.

Cates reports more than \$22,500 has been collected with 900 persons signing memberships. Extra money is being used for a special equipment which was given a test on Sunday. The truck will be moved

about the coverage area and will be put on display.

"People didn't feel we could collect \$22,500," Cates said, "and have hesitate joining. But we have the money, the truck and the equipment. Now we urge those in the area to sign up for immediate coverage. Memberships remain on sale."

Hillsborough and Orange County officials as well as members of surrounding fire departments will be special guests at the dedication ceremony.
