Orange countians were told Tuesday night that funds for a new rural fire department have gone beyond the half-way point.

Marshall Cates of the Exchange Club said that more than \$10,000 has been collected and pledged in the drive for \$20,500 which will be used for a truck and other needed equipment.

"We urge everyone in the rural department area to sign up as soon as possible," Cates said. "We need to get our money together so we can order the truck and the other items."

"Few people have refused us and we are confident we will reach our goal in this much-needed project. Our workers will continue their campaign efforts."

For the present the rural area is served by a 17-year-old truck from Hillsborough and which covers a limited area.
